# Nets & Edges

From a total entry of 125 in the 2016 Liverpool Grand Prix, forty five of them travelled from Wales, Scotland, Ireland and Isle of Man while just eight Liverpool League players entered. Although fees are a shade too expensive, with minimal travelling costs one would have expected more than a handful of local players.

It was disappointing to learn that Ryan Jenkins, the highest world ranked player ever to have appeared in the Liverpool League and in my view, the most talented, didn't enter. On receiving a call from a player that Ryan had retired from GP tournaments, which I understand was posted on the TTE web site, I checked with Ryan before including the 'rumour' in my Echo column. He said he was being selective in which tournaments he'll enter this season but, it was nice to see him over the weekend where he helped a number of players with their game in his capacity of Wales' Team Manager and Head Coach.

In the final sentence of my last 'Nets and Edges' I said that if the 2016 Liverpool GP was to be staged by Table Tennis England, the event would need help and co-operation from Liverpool League members. This turned out to be the case for without it, the event wouldn't have taken off on Saturday. With only Zach Ferris, TTE's Tournament Manager in attendance, it was left to us at 1pm on Friday to set up the courts. With regular 'helpers' Tom Purcell and Graham Rollinson attending the funeral of umpire Derek Sherratt, just two MC members turned up who with half a dozen 'volunteers, set up the two sides of the big hall which took until 5pm. Arthur Upton always prefaced any congratulatory comments by saying he refrained from naming those to whom he was referring, for fear of omitting someone who had helped in any way. While this was a wise thing position to take, I'll mention just Janette Hutchings who weighed in with an invaluable stint and Roly Wright whose young grandson Tom, helped measure the courts using Mike Power's home-made measuring rope. A relieved (I reckon) Zach Ferris, emailed Mike on Monday with his thanks to all who helped over the three days, make the first GP of the season, an unqualified success. Thanks also to those who attended on Sunday night to strip down the courts and load the lorry a thankless task which, nevertheless, was as important as the job completed on Friday.

## <u>Liverpool Grand Prix</u> <u>Don Davies</u>

The First of the Table Tennis England 2016 - 017 Grand Prix circuit

At The Wavertree Tennis Centre 20-21st August 2016

For the first time since the Liverpool and District League organised the inaugural Merseyside Open in 1929, and subsequently, when the present day GP tournaments were introduced, the League didn't organise and run the event, having handed the responsibility to Table Tennis England. The event opened on Saturday 20 th. August at 9 am when the Banded events commenced.

England international Chris Doran swept all before him in the men's singles, the Northampton man winning his third successive GP title having last season won the Blackpool and London titles. In a sparkling encounter, the 17 stone Doran, who ousted the all international trio of Scotland's Niall Cameron, Dan O'Connell (Wales) and England's Darius Knight in successive rounds before facing another England man in Mike O'Driscoll, in the final. To arrive at this stage the Yorkshire man turned back time in the last four dismissing four times Liverpool GP men's champion Gavin Rumgay, who was seeded at one in the disappointing absence of Ryan Jenkins. Doran took the first 11-9 before O'Driscoll, displaying an array of deft flicks, drop shots and fierce counter hitting drives, levelled matters 11-8. Doran, though, the overall GP champion in the 2014/15 season, held firm to take the third 11-8 before continuing his assault on the tiring Yorkshire man to claim the title 9, -8, 8, 5.

Romanian number 4 Lulia Necula, on her Liverpool GP Debut breezed into the final where she took on England number one and the defending overall 2015/16 champion Kelly Sibley. Necula accounted for England international and former Liverpool GP champion Karina Le Fevre in the semi's while Sibley, was avenging her defeat by Wales' number one Charlotte Carey when they last met, this time at the penultimate stage. Necula started in fine style forging a 2-0 lead winning 7 and 7 but, in an amazing turn around, Sibley took the first seven points before being pegged back at 9-9. The 5 times England singles champion though, took the next two points to extend the contest. The former world ranked 141 Romanian, regained the ascendancy in the fourth to take it 11-7 and claim the title.

Rumgay, who had hoped to equal Victor Barna's haul of five Liverpool GP M/S titles, didn't leave empty handed after teaming up with O'Driscoll to overcome the Welsh pairing of Charlotte Carey and Dan O'Connnell, 5, 8, 8 in the open doubles final.

O'Driscoll coming through 11-5, 7-11, 9-11, 11-9, 11-6. It didn't get any easier for the ex-England international, who then faced Scotland's number two, Craig Howieson, in the semi's. Again it went to five, only this time the Yorkshireman had to come from behind winning 11-7 in the decider.

#### TABLE TENNIS 365 /LIVERPOOL


For a number of years the Trevor Owens, the Fixture Secretary for LDTTL has arranged the seasonal fixtures together with the results and averages. It was a lot of hard work for Trevor and developed over the years. Each week Trevor would send out the League tables and results.

About five years ago the English Table Tennis Association were looking at developing a computer programme which could be used by all leagues for table tennis fixtures, results etc. This was subsequently

developed into TT365 which is now used by approximately 200 leagues around the country

TT365 is a purpose developed programme which can be used by any league.

Before the start of the season the details of the clubs, teams and players are put into TT365 by an administrator and the programme immediately creates the fixtures for the

coming season. It also immediately creates the league tables and

averages as the results are input into the programme. Each week as the results are sent to the fixture secretary they are input into the programme and the results and league tables are updated immediately.

The website will also be used to record details of league officials, news items, cup fixtures and results, items of information and links to other table tennis sites.
